(Nineteen miles north of Hot Springs, AR on the Scenic 7 Byway.)

Length: Approximately 17 miles with many trail loop opportunities.

Directions: From Hot Springs, take Highway 7 north to Highway 298. Follow highway 298 about 13 miles to the rifle range signs. Turn left and follow the road to the parking area.

Trail Information: Trail markings are white rectangles and signs. The route travels on a variety of road types including paved, gravel, and unsurfaced.

Site Amenities: There are no developed facilities. Bring your own drinking water.

Difficulty level: Easy to difficult.

Safety: Watch for traffic. You will be sharing the road with motor vehicles.

Requirements: State laws govern the sections of trail along paved roads. Pack it in, pack it out.

Recommended Season: The trail is open year round, but is exceptionally pleasant during fall and spring.
